

Advanced Certificate in Rural Generalist Anaesthesia (RGA) - FAQs

What does Recommended Pre-Learning mean?

• The "Recommendations" are designed to best position yourself to meet the RGA curriculum in 12 months. They are not pre-requisites to apply but are highly encouraged. Please speak with your Rural Generalist Training Advisor (RGTA) if you would like to discuss how best to structure your training and preparation for (RGA).

In what PGY can I apply for the RGA?

- It depends on when you have joined a GP college (you must have completed at least one year of GP fellowship training before starting your RGA). If you are successful in applying for your chosen GP college in PGY1, you could apply for your RGA year in PGY2 to commence DRGA training in PGY3.
- The Queensland Rural Generalist Pathway (QRGP) encourages registrars to apply in PGY3+ to ensure they have the appropriate experience prior to commencement.

Should I try and get a rural rotation before applying for the RGA?

• QRGP strongly recommends all registrars considering a RGA year to have some rural experience. This could be completed as a medical student, but ideally as a prevocational term or during GP fellowship training before applying for the RGA.

What happens if I didn't get rural experience as a medical student?

• There is often opportunity to have rural experience in prevocational years. Speak with your RGTA or Hospital Director of Clinical Training (DCT) to see what opportunities there are for rural exposure.

How long does my rural rotation in resident/registrar years need to be?

• QRGP encourages rural exposure throughout your training. However, there is no minimum or maximum amount of rural experience required prior to the RGA.

What if I am unable to complete the course requirements during my RGA year?

• There are specific courses required for the Advanced Certificate. If there is an issue with course attendance, you would delay your completion of the Diploma. The courses can be completed during your ACRGA year or prior. Please speak with your ACRGA Supervisor and RGTA if you are having issues attending the required courses.

What if I am unable to complete my RGA requirements in 12 months? What if I fail the assessment?

• If you are experiencing challenges throughout your RGA year, please ensure you speak with your DRGA Supervisor and your RGTA early. If you are unable to complete the RGA in 12 months, we will help to construct a plan to provide you the best opportunity to compete your RGA the following year. The maximum duration of the DRGA is two years.
